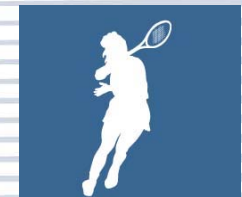

ClassCam Example (cont)

Sue then exits ClassSmart, completely closing the program. Bill logs on to ClassSmart from computer "Remote1," followed by Jill opening ClassSmart on the "Host" computer, the same machine that Sue had been using. Bill is logged off by Idle Logoff, and Sam takes over the workstation at 11:29. No transaction records were edited or deleted by Sam or Jill. They closed down ClassSmart on their respective computers as shown in the example pictorial.

Sorting and Reports

You can sort Event Log records based upon event date, user name and event type. The Event Log report is available, as is the ability to export a copy of the Event Log to Microsoft Excel. Select the View button to toggle between the Event List and the Event Graph

Welcome to ClassCam,™ the user event recording add-in module for the DataMax™ ClassSmart™ database management system. ClassCam enables you to easily monitor the activities of your staff as they use ClassSmart by creating an audit trail of records to facilitate the reconciliation of errors and problems.

License Agreement

ClassSmart software use is authorized under specific terms and conditions outlined in the license agreement that you accepted when you installed the program on your computer. ClassCam Example

Page six shows example ClassCam data, in which it is noted that ClassSmart was opened on 4 December 2005 at 10:31 by Sue. Ten minutes later, Sue is logged off by ClassSmart's idle logoff feature. The program remained open, and soon thereafter, Sue logged on again and changed three transaction records. Perhaps there is a valid reason for date being moved back one month for payment record # 11769 for customer John Doe. Sue may have made a clerical error or failed to properly record the original date - or she might be changing the date to reduce the amount of money expected in the cash drawer for 4 December while still maintaining a proper account balance for John Doe!

Sue goes on to delete a payment and retail record, also for customer John Doe. The customer might have changed his mind about the purchase, or Sue might have printed a ClassSmart receipt for Mr. Doe and then thought that all traces of the activity had been removed so that she could keep the \$45 for herself.

System Requirements

Before installing ClassCam on your computer, please verify that your computer meets these minimum requirements:

- Intel Pentium 233 MHz or faster processor (Pentium III recommended).
- A hard disk with 180 MBytes of free space.
- A double speed or better CD-ROM drive.
- A Microsoft Mouse or compatible pointing device.
- An XVGA (1024 pixel by 768 pixel) monitor display.
- 128 MBytes of RAM
- Microsoft® Windows® 2000 SP3 , Windows XP or later.
- Optional power and file backup devices
- Optional network equipment
- Optional Microsoft Excel® software

Installation and Launch

To install ClassCam, insert the CD into your CD-ROM drive. A dialog box should automatically be displayed. Click the ClassSmart button, and when prompted, please enter the custom installation code provided to you by DataMax. Follow the instructions on the screen to complete installation.

Following installation, double click the ClassCam icon on your Windows' desktop and enter the account name and password provided to you by DataMax. The first time you open the program, you will be asked for a computer security password.

ClassCam displays information from ClassSmart data. Therefore, please ensure that ClassSmart files are accessible before attempting to open ClassCam.

ClassCam uses a special "super user" security account that prevents normal ClassSmart user from accessing ClassCam data.

The Menu Bar

The ClassCam menu bar, located at the top of the main screen, enables you to add super user accounts, change your password, and view the on-line Help file.

The Event Log Screen

When ClassCam is opened, the Event Log screen is displayed that enables you to see all user events in chronological order. All user logon and logoff activity is recorded by ClassCam. This includes automatic logon or logoff initiated ClassSmart's Idle Logoff (ScreenLock) and Idle TimeOut features.

Any ClassSmart record that handles money is monitored by ClassCam. If a transaction date is changed or transaction amount is changed, a ClassCam record is created to document the event. Transaction deletions are also recorded.
